

Dress Code - Student dress should reflect the notion that school is a place of business where student learning is the highest priority.

- a. **Ladies Shirts** - No cleavage. The chest area needs to be covered from armpit to armpit. If a scoop neck or v-neck shirt is below the armpit then a camisole or undershirt must be worn. Bare midriffs are not permitted. No strapless tops or dresses allowed. If a sheer top is worn, a tank top or camisole must be worn so that it covers up cleavage and the stomach area.
- b. **Men's Shirts** - No tank-undershirts are allowed.
- c. **Pants/Skirts/Shorts/Dresses/Hats** - Skirts/shorts/dresses cannot be shorter than 3" above the knee. If a skirt/short/dress is shorter than 3" above the knee – solid, thick leggings must be worn underneath that are no shorter than 3" above the knee. Leggings or tights are not allowed to be worn by themselves. Pants / shorts / skirts should not have large holes in them where excessive amounts of skin or undergarments can be seen. Pants/shorts must sit at the hips, they must not sag so that undergarments can be seen. It is not sufficient for shirts to cover up undergarments. Undergarments must be completely covered by pants/shorts. Hats, hoods, or any head covering such as bandannas or prohibited.
- d. **ALL Clothing** - Clothing and accessories that promote alcohol, tobacco, drug usage or which display weapons or violence and which cause or are likely to cause a disruption within the school environment are prohibited. Clothing and accessories that contain vulgar, derogatory or suggestive diagrams, pictures, slogans or words that may be interpreted as racially, religiously, ethnically, or sexually offensive and which cause or are likely to cause a disruption within the school environment are prohibited.
- e. **Consequences** - Upon arrival to school, students in violation of the dress code will be asked to change before reporting to class. Students who are unable to get a change of clothes will have to sit in ISS until a parent can bring a change of clothes. Repeat offenses will result in further disciplinary action.
