DIVISION LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

Spotsylvania County is located fifty miles south of Washington, D.C. and includes 400 square miles along the southern boundary of the Rappahannock River Region of Virginia. Until recently, Spotsylvania was one of the fastest growing school divisions in the United States. Urban communities emerged in the northern parts of the county while the southern part of the county remains rural. The school district serves over 23,000 students and is comprised of 33 schools (17 elementary, 7 middle, 5 high) as well as a career and technical center, 2 special academies and John J. Wright Educational and Cultural Center. In addition, SCPS participates with area school divisions to offer The Commonwealth Governor's School.

CURRICULUM SUMMARY

Chancellor offers 21 Advanced Placement (AP) courses. AP classes carry weighted credit in the GPA calculation. In addition, Dual Credit courses through which students can earn high school and Germanna Community College credit simultaneously are offered. The Commonwealth Governor's School is a unique school that provides gifted and talented students with a challenging, differentiated and interdisciplinary program in science, mathematics, social studies and English. Courses taken at the Governor's School are identified on the transcript.

English: The English department offers English 9-12 (regular and advanced sections are offered at each grade level). In addition, Advanced Placement (AP) classes are offered in English Literature and Composition and in English Language and Composition. Interested students may also participate in dual enrollment College Composition during their senior year. In addition to traditional offerings, the English department offers several electives including: Public Speaking, Reading Intervention, Journalism, Yearbook Production, Photojournalism, Creative Writing, and Humanities.

Social Studies: The Social Studies department offers a wide variety of courses. Social Studies offerings include: World Geography, Virginia and United States History, Virginia and United State Government and Economics, Psychology, Sociology, African American History, Debate and Criminal Justice. In addition, the department offers several Advanced Placement (AP) classes including: AP Human Geography, AP World History, AP United States History, AP United States Government, AP European History, and AP Psychology.

Math: The Math department offers a wide variety of courses to meet the needs of students. Course offerings include: Algebra, Algebra II, Geometry, Algebra Functions and Data Analysis, Advanced Algebra, Advanced Algebra II, Applied Mathematics, Mathematical Analysis, Computer Mathematics (Visual BASIC and C++) and JAVA. In addition, the department offers Advanced Placement Courses in Statistics, Calculus AB, and Computer Science. Students also have the opportunity to earn high school and college credit simultaneously by taking Dual Enrollment Pre-Calculus.

Science: The Science department offers courses in Earth Science, Advanced Earth Science, Biology, Advanced Biology, Human Anatomy and Physiology, Chemistry, Advanced Chemistry, Chemistry II, Physics, Environmental Science, Astronomy, Meteorology, and Marine Science. Advanced Placement (AP) classes are taught in Environmental Science, Biology, Physics, and Chemistry.

World Languages: Five levels (including AP) are offered in German, Spanish, Latin, and French. In addition, the department offers American Sign Language as an elective.

Visual Arts: A comprehensive art curriculum includes: Art Seminar, Art History/Appreciation, and Theater Arts. In addition, Advanced Placement Studio Art is an option for motivated art students.

Music: Performing and theory classes are offered in Spotsylvania County. These include: Band Class, Percussion Class, Concert Performance Band, Symphonic Performance Band, Performance Jazz Band, Concert Performance, String Orchestra, Symphonic Performance String Orchestra, Women's Chorus/Men's Chorus, Concert Chorus, Select Women's Chorus/Men's Chorus, Vocal Ensemble, and Music Theory. Advanced Placement Music Theory is also available.

Career and Technical: Although many career and technical courses are offered at each high school, students may elect to participate in the Spotsylvania Career and Technical Center (SCTC) programs that are divided into three areas: the Trade & Industry, Family & Consumer Science, and Health & Medical/Protective Services. Each course is a two or four period block program usually offered in a two year sequence beginning in the sophomore year. Students attend academic courses at their home school while enrolled in the SCTC.
