Registration Dates

Due to COVID-19 our summer programs will be held virtually. SCPS will continue to work with no tech, low tech and high tech options for our students. The following definitions will help to determine your student(s) ability to access our summer school program.

- High Tech = Your child has access to the internet AND to a laptop/computer and will be able to fully engage in learning online.
- Low Tech = Your child has access to the internet typically through a cell phone device. Most often work is downloaded, printed, and complete and then submitted via photo/scan of completed work.
- No Tech = No access to the internet or to a device-laptop/computer.

Additionally, SCPS will provide a Google Chrome/Laptop device for families upon request should their child need it for participation..

- Students are eligible to attend summer school if they meet specific criteria. Parents will be notified by school personnel, if eligible.

Summer School Program Information

This guide provides information pertaining to the Spotsylvania County Public Schools (SCPS) virtual summer programs available for students completing grades K-12 during the 2019-2020 school year. Summer programs are available to SCPS students only. Due to the Covid-19 crisis, we are unable to hold our normal summer school programs within our school buildings. Consequently, all instruction will occur in a similar format as outlined in our Continuous Learning Plan 2019-20. While online instruction is most conducive to our delivery of instruction, students will be provided with high tech, low tech and no tech resources similar to our current practice.

Elementary Summer Program - This program is school based, focused on meeting specific academic needs of identified students.

Middle School Summer Program - This program focuses on Math and English skills with a concentration on preparing students for the next academic school year.

8th Grade Summer Program - The 8th grade program provides intensive intervention for students who have completed their 8th grade year and who would benefit from additional learning support before entering 9th grade. Students must be recommended for this program.

High School Summer Program - This program is based on the regular school year academic program. Repeat courses are offered for high school students in grades 9-12 who need to re-take a course for credit and Standards of Learning (SOL) remediation.

Student Responsibilities and Rights

Summer school attendance is a privilege and, accordingly, students are expected to comply with the Spotsylvania County Public Schools Code of Student Conduct.

Elementary Summer Academic Program

SCPS is offering a three week language arts and mathematics academic intervention program for elementary school students. The program will take place Mondays-Thursdays, June 8 – June 25, 2020. These programs will provide intervention and instruction for students enrolled in grades K-5 during the 2019-2020 school year. This year's program will be virtual. Students will interface with their teacher for one hour during the day and be expected to work for one hour on their own or with the support of a parent or family member.

Instruction will focus on language arts and mathematics skills. SCPS is providing this program at no cost. Principals and teachers will select students based on need as evidenced by student performance during the first 3 marking periods. Parents will be notified of the child's selection and the parents will need to agree to the summer school terms in order for the student to participate. Needed materials and no-tech packets will be available to participating students.

Student Expectations - Students are expected to attend virtual lessons via Google hangout with the teacher daily and do the subsequent assignments in preparation for class the next virtual session. If your student does not have a device, one can be checked out to them for this experience.

Registration - Parents of elementary students identified for summer school will receive a phone call invite and subsequent emailed letter for their signature. Parents must follow instructions that accompany the invitation to register their child in the Elementary Summer School Program. If you are unable to take full advantage of all 12 days of this opportunity, please return the form indicating that your child will not attend. Please contact your child's school for questions regarding registration. Applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Students will be enrolled in the summer school program for the grade last completed during the 2019-2020 school year.

High School Academic Program

This program is based on the regular school year academic program. Credit recovery courses are offered for high school students in grades 9-12 who need to recover a course for credit and Standards of Learning (SOL) remediation. The Virtual High School program consists of a blended learning model that includes credit recovery with teacher led instruction.

Registration - Please register early. Enrollment information will be crucial to determine whether or not a class will be held. If you are unsure as to whether or not your child needs to take a repeat course, please contact your child's school counselor. Late registration may delay or prevent registration if the deadline has passed. Only those students who are enrolled in SCPS will be allowed to attend summer school.

Cost - There will be no fee for the 2020 summer school session.

- Non-completion of a credit recovery course within the allotted 14-day session will result in no credit being awarded

Special Education Services

Special education services are offered for students with disabilities needing additional support in the high school academic program. These courses are not offered to non-SCPS students, and any student registering must have a current SCPS IEP. Please contact your home school for assistance with course selection and registration. All forms must be turned into your child's home school guidance department with payment for the course or courses your student is registering.

Transfer Credit

Any SCPS high school student planning to take a class at another summer school outside of the county for the purpose of earning a unit of credit to transfer back to their home high school must receive prior written approval from his or her principal in order for the credit to be recognized.

High School Grading

Student grades will be calculated according to SCPS guidelines.

Credit Recovery Courses -

To register for credit recovery/repeat classes at the Summer Learning Center, click on the following link: <http://summerschool.spotsylvania.k12.va.us/student-registration>. By attending our Virtual High School, an opportunity exists for a student to retake a course in which he/she was previously unsuccessful in earning credit towards graduation. Credit Recovery allows students who have completed seat time and calendar requirements to earn a credit based on competency of the content standards. Credit Recovery courses are complete courses containing all content for which the student will demonstrate mastery before receiving a grade. Courses taken through this credit recovery program will be considered repeat courses. The grades earned will be calculated in the student's cumulative grade point average. Students may register for one credit recovery course.

Driver Education

A student may enroll in classroom driver education (a 6-day class) if he/she has passed 10th grade physical education, but failed the driver education portion of that class. The course begins June 8 and ends June 30. The daily schedule will be Monday through Thursday, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Students must attend all classes to pass the course.

ESOL Summer Program Information

The ESOL summer Program provides support for K-11 English Learners. The purpose of this course is to support both the language development and the academic success of our students through the integration of literacy and the 5Cs (communication, collaboration, critical thinking, creative thinking, and citizenship). Participants will have the opportunity to work on skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking through reading and collaboration with their teacher and peers. Additionally, students will have the opportunity to complete hands-on projects that support the 5Cs.

This course is for newly arrived English Learners in the 2019-2020 school year. Students must be recommended for the program. There is no cost for students.
